Key measures to help prevent the spread of infection and protect staff & children

1. Wash your hands!
2. Clean! Clean! Clean!
3. Keep groups small (max. 15 indoor based settings & 6 outdoor based settings)
4. Avoid/reduce mixing (keep groups consistent)
5. Keep areas clutter free and reduce sharing

Personal Protective Equipment (“PPE”) What should be used and when is this required?

Staff caring for a suspected or confirmed case of COVID

If coming within a 2 metre distance of the symptomatic person, the staff member should wear:

- A mask
- Disposable gloves
- An apron

PPE – what should be used and when is this required?

Cleaning staff

As a minimum the following should be worn during cleaning:

- Disposable gloves
- An apron

PPE – further information

It is important that staff safely remove PPE and then thoroughly wash their hands after use!

Testing

- The need for testing underpins the following scenarios
- Individuals with COVID symptoms should arrange to have a test
- Testing can be arranged by visiting NHS.UK (online) or by contacting NHS 119 via telephone
- Household members should go home and self-isolate for 14 days or until the individual who had symptoms tests negative
- Further information can be found on the Summer In Dorset action card

Scenario 1 – what would you do if....

.... a child becomes unwell whilst at the setting and is displaying COVID symptoms; but their parents can't collect them straight away?

Scenario 1 – you should....

- Arrange for collection of the child (and any of their siblings if also at the group) by their parent/guardian/carer
- **Isolate the child in a ventilated room** behind closed doors until collected
- Young people who can make their own way home safely can do so. They should avoid using public transport or coming into contact with others

Scenario 1 – you should....

- **If isolation is not possible**, the symptomatic person should be moved to an area at least 2 metres from other people
- If an adult at the group needs to come **within 2m of the child** they need to wear PPE (gloves, mask and apron)
- **If the child needs to go to the bathroom**, this should be a separate bathroom if possible. The bathroom should be cleaned thoroughly with standard cleaning products before being used by others

Scenario 2 – what would you do if...

.... a child who was at your setting yesterday became unwell overnight with COVID symptoms?

Scenario 2 – you should....

- Be aware that this is a possible case
- Ask those with symptoms to self-isolate – they should not attend your group
- Only send others home to isolate if they are part of the same household as the possible case (all others can remain at the group)
- Phone PHE Health Protection Team (0300 303 8162) if you have any immediate concerns or if the case is **CONFIRMED** by laboratory testing

(Official contact tracing will not happen until the case is confirmed)

Scenario 3 – what would you do if...

... an immediate family member (who lives in the same household) of a child who attends your setting, has a confirmed case of COVID?

Scenario 3 – you should be aware that....

- The child and their whole household need to self-isolate for 14 days and get tested if they develop symptoms
- The child (and their siblings) should not attend the group
- No further action is needed by the Summer in Dorset group

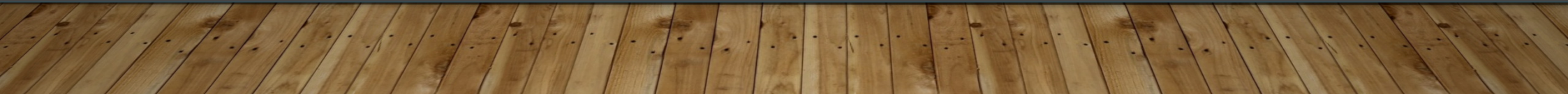

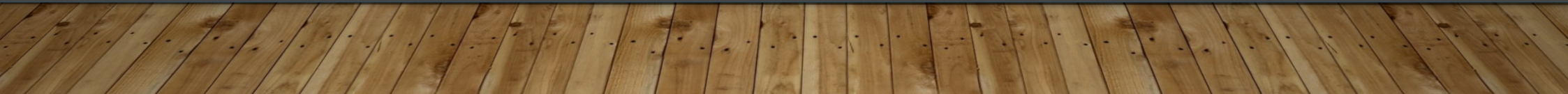
